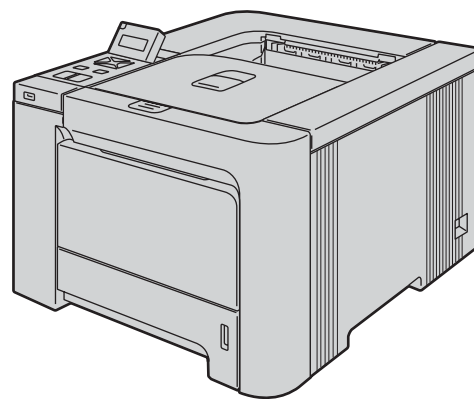

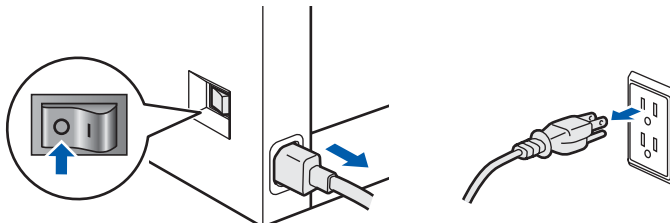

To Use the Printer Safely

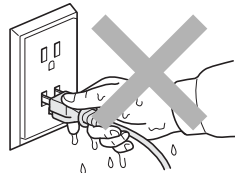
Warning



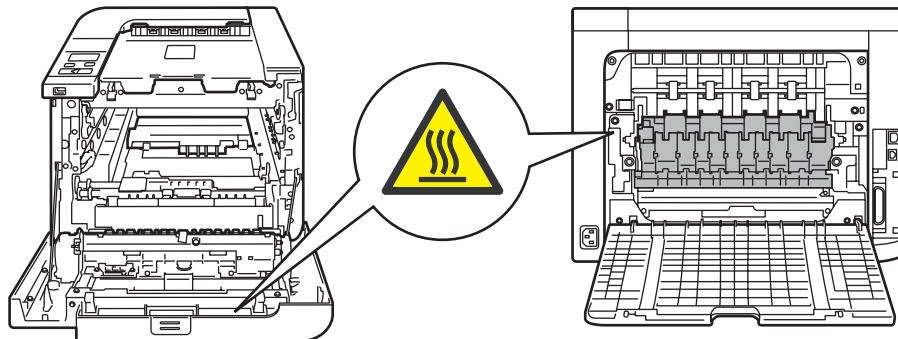
There are high voltage electrodes inside the printer. Before you clean the inside of the printer, make sure that you have turned off the power switch and unplugged the printer from the AC power outlet.



DO NOT handle the plug with wet hands. Doing this might cause an electrical shock.



The fuser unit becomes extremely hot during operation. Wait until it has cooled down sufficiently before replacing consumable items. DO NOT remove or damage the caution labels located on or around the fuser.



DO NOT use flammable substances or any type of spray to clean the inside or outside of the machine. Doing this may cause a fire or electrical shock. Refer to the User's Guide for how to clean the machine.



DO NOT use a vacuum cleaner to clean up scattered toner. Doing this might cause the toner dust to ignite inside the vacuum cleaner, potentially starting a fire. Please carefully clean the toner dust with a dry, lint-free cloth and dispose of it according to local regulations.



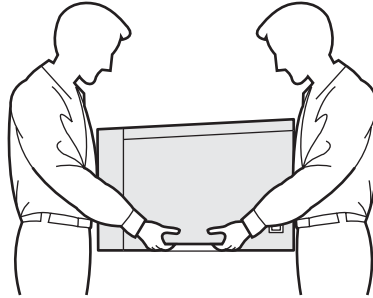

This printer is heavy and weighs approximately 64.2 lb. (29.1 kg). To prevent injuries use at least two people to lift the printer. Be careful not to pinch your fingers when you put the printer back down.

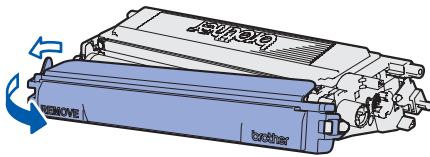


3 Installing the toner cartridges

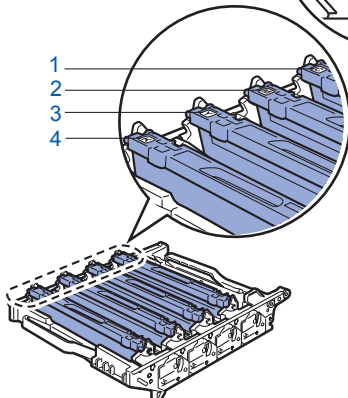
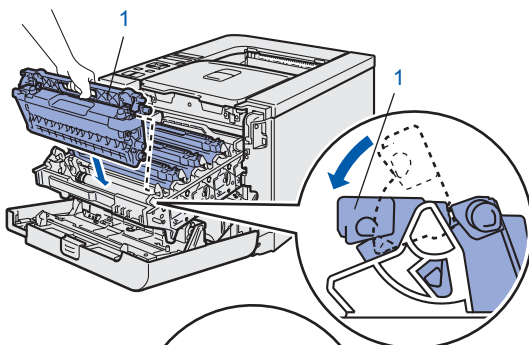
- 1 Unpack the toner cartridges and rock each toner cartridge 5 to 6 times.



- 2 Remove the protective cover.



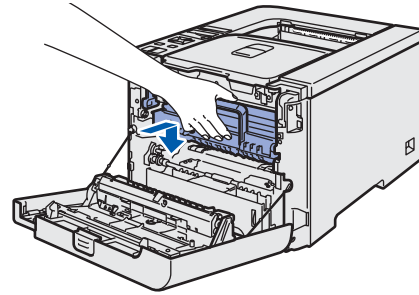
- 3 Hold the handle of the toner cartridge and slide it into the drum unit. Make sure that you match the toner cartridge color to the same color label on the drum unit, and make sure that you fold down the toner cartridge handle (1) once the toner cartridge is in place.



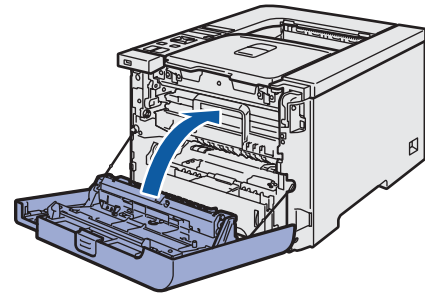

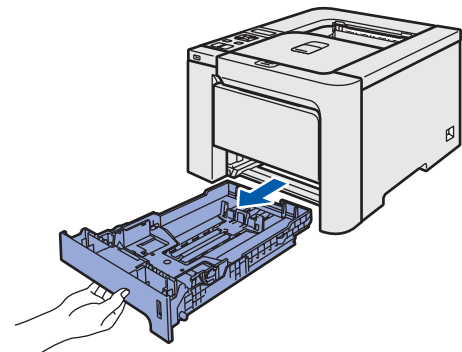

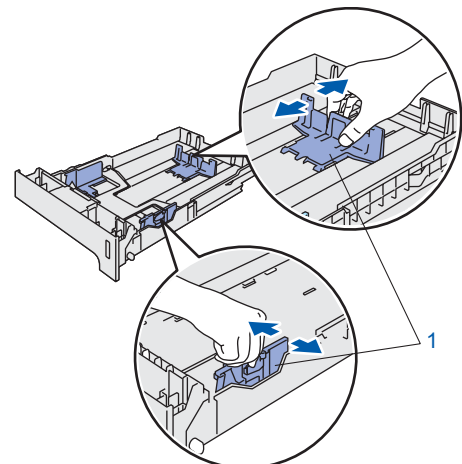


4 Loading paper in the paper tray

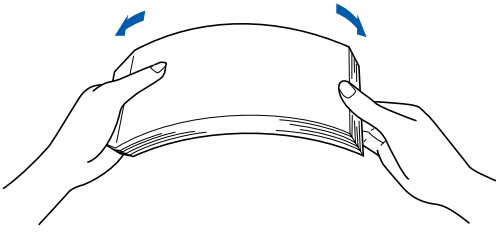

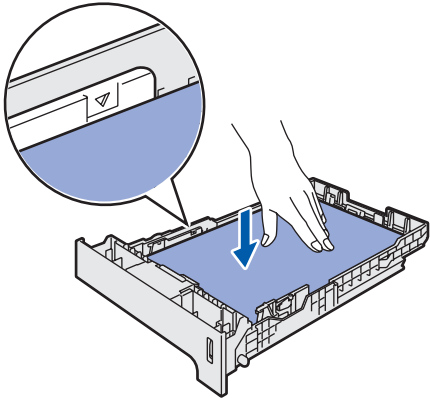
- 2 While pressing the green paper-guide release lever (1), slide the paper guides to fit the paper size. Make sure that the guides are firmly in the slots.



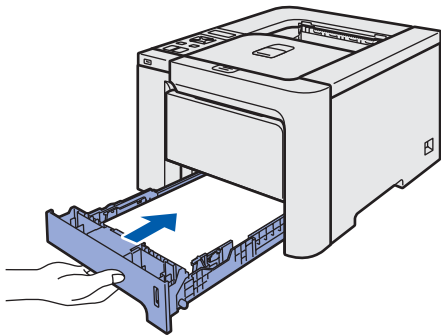
