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General setup

Memory storage

Your menu settings are stored permanently, and in the event of a power failure will not be lost. Temporary settings (for example, Page Layout) will be lost.

Sleep Mode

You can choose how long the machine will remain idle before it goes into Sleep Mode (up to 60 minutes). The timer will restart if any operation is carried out on the machine.

Press Menu.

- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose 0.Initial Setup. Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose 3.Sleep Mode. Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose 1 Min, 2 Mins, 3 Mins, 5 Mins, 10 Mins, 30 Mins or 60 Mins, which is the length of time the machine is idle before entering Sleep Mode. Press OK.

5 Press Stop/Exit.

Auto Power Off

The Auto Power Off feature will turn the machine off one hour after entering Sleep Mode. When this feature is Off, the machine will not power off automatically.

Note that the machine will not power off automatically when:

- the machine is connected to a wireless network
- On is selected in the WLAN Enable setting

Press Menu.

 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose 0.Initial Setup. Press **OK**.

- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose 5.Auto Power Off. Press OK.
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose On (or Off). Press OK.
- 5 Press Stop/Exit.

LCD display

Changing LCD language

You can change the LCD language.



Press ▲ or ▼ to choose

0.Initial Setup. Press OK.

- Oress ▲ or ▼ to choose 0.Local Language. Press OK.
- 4) Press \blacktriangle or \lor to choose your language. Press OK.



LCD Contrast

You can adjust the LCD contrast. If you are having difficulty reading the LCD, try changing the contrast setting.



Press Menu.

- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose 0.Initial Setup. Press OK.
- 3 Press **▲** or **▼** to choose
 - 2.LCD Contrast. Press OK.
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Light or Dark. Press OK.

Printing reports

Reports

The following reports are available:

- User Settings Prints a list of your settings.
- Network Config Prints a list of your Network settings.
- WLAN Report Prints a WLAN connection report.

How to print a report

1 Press Menu.

- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose 4.Print Reports. Press OK.
- Oress ▲ or ▼ to choose the report you want to print. Press OK.



- 4 Press Mono Start.
- 5 Press Stop/Exit.

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Making copies

Copy settings

When you want to quickly change the copy settings temporarily for the next copy, use the Copy keys. You can use different combinations of settings.



If you want more than one copy, press **Number of Copies** repeatedly until the number of copies you want appears (up to 99). Or press ▲ or ▼ to change the number of copies.

When you have finished changing settings, press **Mono Start** or **Colour Start**.

The machine returns to its default settings 1 minute after it finishes copying.

🖉 Note

You can save some of the copy settings you use most often by setting them as the default. You can find instructions on how to do this in the section for each feature.

Stop copying

To stop copying, press Stop/Exit.

Enlarging or reducing the copied image

You can choose an enlargement or reduction ratio. If you choose Fit to Page, your machine will adjust the size automatically to the paper size you set.

- Load your document.
- Enter the number of copies you want.
- 3 Press Enlarge/Reduce.
- Do one of the following:
 - Press ▲ or ▼ to choose the enlargement or reduction ratio you want. Press OK.
 - Press ▲ or V to choose Custom (25-400%). Press OK. Press ▲ or V repeatedly to enter an enlargement or reduction ratio from 25% to 400%. Press OK.

Press Mono Start or Colour Start.

🖉 Note

- Fit to Page does not work properly when the document on the scanner glass is skewed more than 3 degrees. Using the document guidelines on the left and top, place your document in the upper left hand corner, with the document face down on the scanner glass.
- Page Layout is *not* available with Enlarge/Reduce.

Changing copy speed and quality

You can choose the speed and quality. The factory setting is Normal.

Press Copy Quality	Normal	Normal is the recommended mode for ordinary printouts. This produces good copy quality with good copy speed.
	Fast	Fast copy speed and lowest ink consumption. Use to save time printing documents to be proof-read, large documents or many copies.
	Best	Use Best mode to copy precise images such as photographs. This provides the highest resolution and the slowest speed.

- 1 Load your document.
 - Enter the number of copies you want.
- 3 Press Copy Quality repeatedly to choose Normal, Fast or Best.

Press Mono Start or Colour Start.

To change the default setting, follow the instructions below:

- 1 Press Menu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to choose 2.Copy. Press OK.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose 3.Quality. Press OK.
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose Normal, Fast or Best. Press OK.
- 5 Press Stop/Exit.

Copy Options

Adjusting Density

You can adjust the copy density to make copies darker or lighter.



Making N in 1 copies or a poster (Page Layout)

The N in 1 copy feature can help you save paper by letting you copy two or four pages onto one printed page.

You can also produce a poster. When you use the poster feature your machine divides your document into sections, then enlarges the sections so you can assemble them into a poster.

- Load your document.
 - Enter the number of copies you want.¹
 - ¹ You can only make one copy at a time when you are using Poster(3x3) layout.
- 3 Press Copy Options and ▲ or ▼ to choose Page Layout. Press OK.
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose 2in1(P), 2in1(L), 2in1(ID)¹, 4in1(P), 4in1(L), Poster(3x3) or Off(1in1). Press OK.

If you are making a poster, the machine scans the page and starts printing.

2 in 1 ID Copy (Page Layout)

You can copy both sides of your identification card onto one page, keeping the original card size. Make sure the paper size is set to A4 or Letter.



You can copy an identification card to the extent permitted under applicable laws. (➤➤Product Safety Guide: *Unlawful use of copying equipment*)

1 Place your identification card face down at the left corner of the scanner glass.



- 1 3 mm or greater (top, left)
- 2 Enter the number of copies you want.
- 3 Press Copy Options and ▲ or ▼ to choose Page Layout. Press OK.
- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose 2in1(ID). Press OK.
- 5 Press Mono Start to scan the first side of the card. You can also press Colour Start if you are making only one colour copy.

6 After the machine has scanned the page, press ▲ (Yes) to scan the next page.



7 Turn over the identification card and place it at the left corner of the scanner glass. Press OK.

Routine maintenance

Cleaning and checking the machine

Cleaning the outside of the machine

Clean the outside of the machine as follows:



Important

- · Use neutral detergents. Cleaning with volatile liquids such as thinner or benzine will damage the outside surface of the machine.
- · DO NOT use cleaning materials that contain ammonia.
- · DO NOT use isopropyl alcohol to remove dirt from the control panel. It may crack the panel.
- Pull the paper tray (1) completely out of the machine.



Wipe the outside of the machine with a dry, soft lint-free cloth to remove dust.



- Lift the output paper tray cover and remove anything that is stuck inside the paper tray.
- 4) Wipe the inside and outside of the paper tray with a dry, soft lint-free cloth to remove dust.



Close the output paper tray cover and put the paper tray firmly back in the machine.

Cleaning the machine's printer platen

WARNING

Be sure to unplug the machine from the electrical socket before cleaning the printer platen to avoid an electrical shock.

- Using both hands, grasp the plastic tabs on both sides of the machine and lift the scanner cover until it locks securely in the open position.
- 2 Clean the machine's printer platen (1) and the area around it, wiping off any scattered ink with a *dry*, soft lint-free cloth.

Lift the scanner cover to release the lock (1). Gently push the scanner cover support down (2) and close the scanner cover (3).





Re-connect the power cord.

Cleaning the paper pick-up rollers

- Unplug the machine from the electrical socket.
 - Pull the paper tray completely out of the machine.

🖉 Note

If the machine has been feeding multiple pages when there are only a few sheets of paper left in the tray, clean the Base Pad (1) with a soft lint-free cloth slightly moistened with water.

After cleaning, wipe the pad with a *dry*, soft lint-free cloth to remove all moisture.



Open the Jam Clear Cover (1) at the back of the machine.

Clean the Paper Pick-up Rollers (1) with a soft lint-free cloth moistened with water.

Slowly turn the rollers so that the whole surface is cleaned.

After cleaning, wipe the rollers with a *dry*, soft lint-free cloth to remove all moisture.



- 5 Close the Jam Clear Cover. Make sure the cover is closed completely.
 - Put the paper tray firmly back in the machine.
 - Re-connect the power cord.

Checking the ink volume

You can check the ink that is left in the cartridge.



Press ▲ or **▼** to choose 1. Ink. Press OK.

Press ▲ or **▼** to choose 3. Ink Volume. Press OK.

The LCD shows the ink volume.

4 Press ▲ or ▼ to choose the colour you want to check.



5 Press Stop/Exit.

Packing and shipping the machine

When you transport the machine, use the packing materials that came with your machine. Follow the instructions below to correctly package your machine. Damage caused to your machine during transit may not be covered by your warranty. The machine should be adequately insured with the carrier.

Important

It is important to allow the machine to "park" the print head after a print job. Listen carefully to the machine before unplugging it to make sure that all mechanical noise has stopped. Not allowing the machine to finish this process may lead to print problems and possible damage to the print head.



Open the ink cartridge cover.

Remove all four ink cartridges. Press the ink release lever above each cartridge to release it. (➤>Basic User's Guide: Replacing the ink cartridges)

3 Install the green protective part and then close the ink cartridge cover.



Important

• Make sure that the plastic tabs on both sides of the green protective part (1) have securely clicked into place (2).



- If you are not able to find the green protective part, ship the machine without it. DO NOT install the ink cartridges as an alternative before shipping.
 - Unplug the machine from the electrical socket.

- 5 Do one of the following:
 - If you have connected the machine to your computer using the USB interface cable, go to step 6.
 - If you have not connected the interface cable, go to step 8.
- 6 Using both hands, use the plastic tabs on both sides of the machine to lift the scanner cover until it locks securely in the open position. Then unplug the interface cable from the machine.
- 7 Lift the scanner cover to release the lock (1). Gently push the scanner cover support down (2) and close the scanner cover (3).





Wrap the machine in the bag.



9 Pack the machine and the printed materials in the original carton with the original packing material as shown below.

Do not pack the used ink cartridges in the carton.



10 Close the carton and tape it shut.

Glossary

This is a comprehensive list of features and terms that appear in Brother manuals. Availability of these features depends on the model you purchased.

Density

Changing the Density makes the whole image lighter or darker.

Greyscale

The shades of grey available for copying and scanning.

Innobella™

Innobella[™] is a range of genuine consumables offered by Brother. For best quality results Brother recommends Innobella[™] Ink and Paper.

LCD (Liquid Crystal Display)

The display screen on the machine that shows interactive messages during On-Screen Programming.

Menu mode

Programming mode for changing your machine's settings.

Scanning

The process of sending an electronic image of a paper document into your computer.

Temporary settings

You can choose certain copy options without changing the default settings.

User Settings

A printed report that shows the current settings of the machine.

WLAN Report

A printed report that shows the result of the WLAN Connection.
